


Future of Water Introducing Strategic Water Planning

Universal pressures

The impact of existing and emerging environmental, socioeconomic, and geopolitical forces on water will be realised in different ways in different parts of the world over the coming decades. Increasingly frequent and extreme weather events, rising sea levels, ageing infrastructure, population growth and demographic shifts are just some of the universal pressures causing uncertainty. Across all geographies and aspects of the water cycle, our clients have told us that the complex, rapid change resulting from these dynamic, global forces is making the challenge of long-term planning even more acute. As a result, traditional planning approaches are quickly becoming outdated and new, more agile thinking is required.



A future-focused approach

It's about bringing diverse perspectives and longer-term thinking together to deliver our clients increased optionality and multiple benefits.
